The blue and pink chevrons represent the transgender community and a purple chevron which intersects with the white represents the land we are on, the Haudenosaunee and Anishinaabe communities, and the Two Row Wampum agreement.

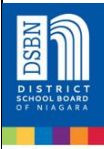
Summary of Key Changes to the Science Curriculum

What is the same?

- ❑ Overall goals

- ❑ Majority of unit content, expectations and assessment guidelines

What is different?

- ❑ STEM skills embedded throughout and also a standalone strand
- ❑ Modernized expectations and examples
- ❑ New content that focuses on coding, skill trades, food literacy, climate change and safety
- ❑ Indigenous Knowledge and Perspectives



NEW Science Curriculum Overview

- Focus of PD
 - Will support scientific experimentation, scientific research, and engineering design processes
 - Support the the understanding of scientific concepts and new content
 - Support the implementation of relating the curriculum to local issues and a complex changing world
- PD will begin this summer during institutes and continue in the fall.

Dreambox

What's good about Dreambox?

1. The program “**teaches**” not just “test” to foster student learning when a teacher is not present
2. It's **adaptive** to support students in different places in their learning.
3. It develops **models for thinking** which supports development of mathematical understanding.
4. The learning environment is more **visual** than auditory.

Plan for 2022/2023

At Lockview, we will make a decision based on each teacher's professional judgement if they will use DreamBox. This will be done in September.
