	<ul> <li>Old Business follow up:</li> <li>Principle Profile – Questions for the council to complete and will be kept at the school going will be discussed in October 2024</li> <li>Lockview Shirt Swap or donation will be done in September 2024 at the Lockview family night September 19<sup>th</sup>. We can set this up in the school gym. See if we can get cloth racks to help display Lockview Spirit Wear to keep things organized. Book fair week Sept 16<sup>th</sup>.</li> <li>Can we make up a one page School Council Information pamphlet to be given with the new student package for Kindergarten registration – Adelaide Lepp with create a one page document with the information provided by Trish Houtby.</li> <li>Instagram page to post information for Lockview families has been set up.</li> <li>Jungle Sport has been booked for 2025/2026 school year.</li> </ul>					
	<ul> <li>New Business:</li> <li>Community Survey was done by 75 families. Some of the highlights: <ul> <li>Food selection was positive (this is done by the student council)</li> <li>Parking lot, and how to improve the congestion with pick up/drop off (remove the playground)</li> <li>Request for a Christmas Concert as this is done at other schools.</li> <li>Fundraising for next year as 77% of those in the survey would rather do that than Delta Bingo at 31%. Each student would have to raise \$36.00 to cover what Lockview makes from Delta Bingo. We will look at other fundraising opportunities for next year (Cobbs Bread, Krispy Crème, Apples, Magazines). We will look at creating a Video to inform others about what to expect during a Delta Bingo shift and how it helps Lockview with funds throughout the year for things like a new Playground, Equipment, Math/Language Tools, Jungle Sport)</li> </ul> </li> <li>Trish Houtby will summarize/highlight in more detail in the June newsletter.</li> </ul>					

	<ul> <li>In September School Council will discuss doing more Community Events for the 2024/2025 school year. Stem Night, Movie Night, Community Night with a few different options for everyone (events like math, crafts, sports).</li> <li>Playground will be started next year as we have enough funds to start the process. Trish provided a few options to look at. We discussed the need for it to be accessible to all which is already being considered.</li> <li>A special treat will be sent home June 6<sup>th</sup> with students as a volunteer appreciation. As well, there will be a social dinner in the Library on June 11<sup>th</sup> to say thank you helping contribute to another amazing year at Lockview. More details to follow.</li> </ul>
