QUESTIONS PARENTS CAN ASK TO THEIR CHILD AFTER SCHOOL

Identity: What did you learn about yourself today? What did you learn about other cultures? Do you feel like something caused you to have a stronger and positive sense of self?

Skills: What new skills did you learn today in the content areas? Do you feel confident in skills learned? What do need more help in?

Intellectualism: What did you become smarter about today? What do you like to learn about? Did your learning connect with the real world?

<u>Criticality</u>: Did you learn about anything related to humanity, problem solving or how to make the world better today? What did you learn about justice? Did your teachers create spaces for self empowerment? How?

Jog: Did you experience jay today? What did you learn that is connected to something beautiful or good in the world?



★ Grade 3 and 6 EQAO EQAO Assessment is Changing

- Online, adaptive
- EQAO will be defining new levels of achievement and baselines in Summer 2022
- Will assess the new Mathematics Curriculum
- Results will be based on full participating students only (in-person and remote learning students who write in person)

- A freamework and sample assessments were released two weeks ago
 - Inforamtion and training will follow

We have a lot to learn about the new assessments, so we have asked our teachers to be patient and keep the learning each learner.

Bottom line: It's all so new...until we learn more, we can't really practice for EQAO

- But in saying this....we are looking at informal assessment (mid-year) to collect contextual data from our Grade 3 and 6 students.
- It's an opportunity to 'check-in' on some concepts and skills
- An opportunity to try various assessment ideas; including to emphasize assessment as and for learning
- An opportunity to empower educators to assess aspects that they have focused on and valued in their classrooms
- An opportunity to build student confidence and their identity as learners

★ Niagara Region Public Health Update

Beginning Tuesday February 22nd, DSBN will discontinue providing cohort contact information to NRPH for COVID positive cases and cohort dismissals.

As we transition to the next stage in COVID-19 management, the data has been inconclusive to support Niagara Region in continuing to dismiss cohorts when compared to the rest of the province. Hospitalization rates have been decreasing equally in Niagara as the rest of the province.

DSBN values in person learning and we continue to be committed to providing a safe learning environment for both staff and students. Everyone must complete their daily self- screening and be vigilant to stay home when ill. The four Niagara School Boards will continue to follow Ontario Ministry of Education and Ministry of Health provincial direction and report absenteeism rates of 30% or higher due to illness in schools.

Graduation: A Graduation committee has been formed and we look forward to providing some guidance soon as we know you will want to start your planning.

Staff meetings: Staff Meetings can move to in person effective immediately. Please note at this time we are still only allowing for essential visitors and School council meetings will remain virtual until further notice.

Music: We are delighted to be able to resume indoor singing at this time. Please ensure that students are masked and distanced.

Items listed on the permit included; Literacy Resources, Playground repairs, Kinder Resources and Furniture, Library Resources, Classroom Resources, Kinder Courtyard Expansion and Physical Education equipment inside and outside). Also included was a request for a 5 year plan to hold back \$5000 per year from the Bingo account to purchase new playground equipment.
